In 2006, Purdue University Calumet was granted \$1.7 million from the U.S. Department of Education to develop an experiential learning curriculum. Experiential education allows students to actively engage in “real” situations—on-the-job, in the community, in the larger society—using, attaining, and reflecting on their knowledge and skills. Beginning this year, 2008, all entering students will need to complete two experiential components for graduation.

To assist faculty in designing and implementing such courses, the Vice Chancellor for Academic Affairs, the Center for Student Achievement, and the Center for Instructional Excellence have requested and reviewed proposals for curriculum development. This year 12 recipients working on 7 projects received development grants. They will be recognized at this luncheon—and several will report on their plans and their progress.
