Last year, Purdue University Calumet was granted \$1.7 million from the U.S. Department of Education to initiate experiential learning at our campus. Experiential education allows students to actively engage in “real” situations—on-the-job, in the community, in the larger society—using, attaining, and reflecting on their knowledge and skills. Last spring, the Faculty Senate voted to have students take two experiential courses (or equivalent) for graduation.
